

FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for the City of Bonita Springs Citywide Parks Facilities and Equipment repair due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 4813). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Proposed Work and Purpose:** The City of Bonita Springs proposes to use FEMA Public Assistance funds to replace a granite veterans monument, repair 2 metal pergolas, replace outdoor lighting elements, lightning detection systems, irrigation systems, fountain pumps, and sod, and replace metal railing, canvas awnings, and aluminum gutters at Riverside Park.
- Project Alternatives:** The alternative that has been considered is the no action alternative. This alternative is not feasible as the facility is designated for open-space recreational use, the loss of which may have adverse social, cultural, and economic impacts on the community.
