43	Section 2. Creating Chapter 26, Article IV – Credit Card Skimmers			
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1 2	The Bonita Springs City Code is hereby amended creating Chapter 26, Miscellaneous Offenses, Article IV, Credit Card Skimmers. Such Article is created as follows:

4 5	The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this Article, shall have the meanings set forth herein:				
6 7	(a)	"Fuel Pump" shall mean a machine or device used to dispense petroleum fuel for sale to the public at retail.			
8 9	(b)	"Payment Card" shall have the same meaning as defined in §817.625, Florida Statutes, as may hereafter be amended.			
10 11	(c)	"Owner" shall mean the record title owner of the property on which a Fuel Pump is located.			
12 13	(d)	"Operator" shall mean the person or legal entity which leases, manages, or operates a Fuel Pump.			
14 15	(d)	"Scanning Device" shall have the same meaning as defined in §817.625, Florida Statutes, as may hereafter be amended.			
16	Sec. 26-71. – Fuel Pump Security Requirements				
17 18 19 20 21	(a)	Each Fuel Pump which contains a Scanning Device in Bonita Springs shall have affixed to or installed on the exterior of any Fuel Pump a visible Fuel Pump lock, which requires an access key unique to each facilities' location, to restrict the unauthorized access of consumer Payment Card information. The access key shall be maintained at the facility at all times.			
22 23	(b)	As an alternative to the foregoing security measure, one or more of the following security measures may be implemented:			
24 25 26		(1) A device or anti-breach system that will render the Fuel Pump, or the Scanning Device in the Fuel Pump, inoperable if the Fuel Pump is accessed without proper security code entry; or			
27 28 29 30		(2) A tamper-resistant or responsive security module, device or system that encrypts the customer Payment Card information in the Scanning Device or upon detecting an intrusion disables the Scanning Device and causes a zeroisation of all sensitive data.			
31 32		The Owner or Operator of any Fuel Pump that chooses to install an alternative security measure pursuant to this section shall			

- demonstrate compliance with this section of the Code to a code or 1 law enforcement officer. 2
- Fuel Pumps that have been found in compliance with this section may be 3 (C) appropriately marked by the appropriate enforcing entity for identification 4 purposes. 5
- A security measure affixed or installed on a Fuel Pump pursuant to 6 (d) subsections (A) or (B) shall be maintained by the Owner or Operator in 7 good working condition at all times. 8
- The requirements provided by this Article shall apply in City of Bonita 9 (e) Springs and are to be enforced by City code enforcement officers and the 10 Office of the Lee County Sheriff. 11
- Sec. 26-72. Violations 12
- When discovered by a law enforcement officer, a violation of any portion of this (a) 13 Ordinance by an owner or operator may be punishable by a fine not exceeding 14 \$250.00 per fuel pump. Each day that a violation exists shall constitute a 15 separate and distinct violation. 16
- (b) When discovered by a code enforcement officer, a violation of any portion of this 17 Article shall subject the owner or operator to the code enforcement provisions 18 and procedures provided in City Code and Chapter 162, Florida Statutes, as may 19 be amended. Violations of this Article may be punishable by a fine of up to 20 \$250.00 per fuel pump. Each day that a violation exists shall constitute a 21 separate and distinct violation. 22

SEVERABILITY

- The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and it is the intention to confer the 25 26 whole or any part of the powers herein provided for. If any court of competent jurisdiction shall hold any of the provisions of this Ordinance unconstitutional, the decision of such 27 court shall not affect or impair any remaining provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby 28 declared to be the legislative intent that this Ordinance would be adopted had such 29 unconstitutional provision not been included therein. 30
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Section 4. **CONFLICTS OF LAW** 32 33

Whenever the requirements or provisions of this Ordinance are in conflict with the 34 requirements or provisions of any other lawfully adopted City of Bonita Springs ordinance 35 or Florida Statutes, the more restrictive shall apply. 36

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1 Section 5. CODIFICATION AND SCRIVENER'S ERRORS

It is the intention of the City Council that the provisions of this Ordinance shall 3 become and be made part of the Bonita Springs Code; that sections of this Ordinance 4 5 may be renumbered or re-lettered and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such 6 7 intention; and that any typographical errors which do not affect the intent may be 8 authorized by the City Manager without need of public hearing, by filing a corrected copy with the City Clerk. It is further the intent of the City Council that the provisions of this 9 Ordinance may be modified as a result of consideration that may arise during public 10 11 hearing(s) and that such modifications shall be incorporated into the final version.

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Section 6. EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of this ordinance shall be thirty (30) days from its adoption date.
