

Pros:

- Adjacent to Bonita Springs Elementary
- Parking
- Close to Downtown
- Mid-sized parcel for possible expansion

Cons:

- No restrooms
- Not visible from Old 41
- Site prep work costly due to tree removal



Depot Park 0.54 acres 23,700 Square Feet

Pros:

- Restroom facilities
- Downtown location
- Visible from Riverside Park, Old 41 & Pennsylvania Ave
- Parking
- Drinking fountains
- Shaded Picnic areas
- Large parcel for easy expansion

Cons:

- Area used for some events
- Would the skate park fit into the natural surroundings of the Park





Option 1: 3,000 Square ft. Concrete Park approximate cost \$130,000



Option 3: 6,500 Square ft. Concrete Park approximate cost \$265,000



Option 5: 20,000 Square ft. Concrete Park approximate cost \$800,000 - \$900,000

Local Skate Park Information

The Edge Skate Park at Fleischmann Park – Naples

- 40,000 Sq. ft. Skate park with a combination of both wood and concrete features
- Not supervised, use at your own risk
- Fees: Collier Co. Residents Annual pass: \$60

Non-Resident 6 month pass: \$60

Daily Fee: \$20

- 130 members
- Approximately 10 -30 participants per day, weather depending
- Hours of operation: Skate: TWF 10 am -8 pm Sat. 4-8 pm Sun 12 -4

Bike: M/TH 10 am-8pm Sat 12-4 pm Sun 4-8

Local Skate Park Info (con't)

Wheels Skate Park and BMX Track - Naples

- 25,000 Sq. ft. for Skate Park section only
- Not Supervised, but staff can view cameras from Rec Center
- Fee: Under 18 annual pass: \$10

Over 18 annual pass: \$25

Daily Fee: \$5

- 300 members, but includes the BMX track as well
- Approximately 30 participants per day for skate park only
- Hours of Operation: M/T/W/F 3 8 pm

Saturday 1 -8:30 pm

Sunday 1 – 6 pm

Thursday closed

Timeline for Construction

- The procurement process for a Design Build project is approximately 4-5 months for a contractor to be selected
- The timeline for construction will depend on location chosen and the amount of site prep work required.
 Construction with minimal site prep will be approximately 3-4 months
